MELANDRI BIDS TO GET BACK ON

BMW rider Marco Melandri is looking to get his eni FIM Superbike World Championship title aspirations back on track at Motorland Aragon following an encouraging test at the Spanish circuit.

The Italian sits fourth in the standings but has fallen 55 points behind series leader and compatriot Max Biaggi in the race for the championship.

BMW Motorrad Motorsport racer Melandri had put himself firmly in the frame after picking up wins at Donington Park in England and the American round at Miller Motorsports Park, but the last round on home soil at Misano proved a disappointment as he could only manage a fourth place and a non-finish from the two races on the Adriatic coast.

But the 29-year-old enjoyed a great weekend in Aragon last season, picking up a win and a second place, and is in a confident mood following the recent test there. "It was a good day," said Melandri. "We have been working very hard and we almost

completed our programme. Actually we missed some runs due to the previous day's rain, but we could more or less do all that we had planned. I am happy with the race rhythm. I think we found some good solutions.

"I don't know how the weather will be, but overall I am confident for the race here in Aragon. We did a good job preparing for it."

Kawasaki Racing Team's Tom Sykes is another man who heads to Aragon pleased with the outcome of his testing work.

The British racer is nine points and one place better off than Melandri in the title chase, and racked up 81 laps on the second day of testing last week.

That amounts to almost four race distances and allowed Sykes and his team to work through myriad set-up options for this weekend.

Sykes, who has taken five pole positions so far this season, said: "On day two all the bikes going round got rid of the car tyre rubber and the track is cleaning up nicely. It was a productive day. We tried a long list of things on the bike and we got through everything just as the circuit closed.

"That was down to good organisation from my guys and we managed to make it count. We did a lot of testing but that's what we are here for."















SUPERSPORT (***) FIM WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

Jules Cluzel has been delighted with his debut in the FIM Supersport World Championship – but will settle for nothing less than title success as the series reaches its halfway point at Motorland Aradon.

The PTR Honda rider lies 22 points behind leader Kenan Sofuoglu, and said: "I am really happy to be second but it is also my target to be on top of this championship."

BMW Motorrad Italia GoldBet rider Sylvain Barrier will look to continue his dominance of the FIM Superstock 1000 Cup at Motorland Aragon.

Barrier has won three of the four rounds so far, only failing to score at Monza after suffering a shoulder injury, and looks wellplaced to secure title glory.

His nearest rival, Barni Racing Team Italia's Lorenzo Savadori, will be bidding to reduce his current nine-point deficit.

The Dutchman claimed his second win of the season at Misano last time out, and said: "The difference with championship leader Riccardo Russo is down to just two points, and I can't wait to go to Aragon," he said.



SERIES SPREADS WINGS TO INDIA

India will become the 27th country to host a round of the eni FIM Superbike World Championship when the Buddh International Circuit joins the calendar in 2013. It will be the first international bike racing championship to be hosted at the Hermann Tilke-designed track near Delhi. The contract runs from 2013 to 2016, and next season's round is scheduled for March 10.

Paolo Flammini, CEO of Infront Motor Sports, said: "The inclusion of the Indian round represents a great achievement for our series and reflects our continuous target to further extend its international presence. India is one of the most important motorcycle markets in the world. Undoubtedly the inclusion of this event will greatly benefit all the protagonists of our series and will create significant added value for the motorcycle manufacturers."

NEW TV DEAL FOR BRAZILIAN FANS

Infront Sports & Media has extended the media rights agreement with ESPN Brazil for the eni FIM Superbike World Championship. The agreement with the largest commercial broadcaster in the country is now exclusive and covers a three-year period starting from the 2013 season. ESPN Brazil will provide full live and delayed coverage in HD quality of all 14 rounds of all classes, including Supersport and Superstock.

João Palomino, Director of Journalism of ESPN Brazil, said: "The eni FIM Superbike World Championship is a first-class TV product and an attractive content for our audience as the series provides more tension, excitement and action than any other motorsport. With ESPN as the exclusive broadcaster in Brazil, fans can look forward to receiving extensive coverage of the highest quality throughout the next three years."

BRIGNOLA ROLLS BACK THE YEARS

Former Italian Superbike champion Norino Brignola is set to return to the eni FIM Superbike World Championship after a five-year absence at Motorland Aragon this weekend.

Brignola made 14 starts between 2005 and 2007 and won his national championship in 2005 and 2009. He has now been called up by the Grillini Progea team, who have used a series of riders throughout the season.

The team have yet to choose a full-time replacement for Australian rider Mark Aitchison, who left the squad five rounds into the season.

Grillini Progea entered Jake Holden for the American round of the series in Salt Lake City, while Federico Sandi was aboard the BMW S1000RR at Misano last time out.

SYLVAIN WAITING FOR LADY LUCK TO SMILE

Sylvain Guintoli achieved a career ambition when he won his first race in the eni FIM Superbike World Championship earlier this season but, since his one-two at Assen, the flying Frenchman feels the only thing that has deserted him is good fortune. Now seventh in the championship – having been as high as third at one stage – the Team Effenbert Liberty rider knows he and his bike have what it takes to fight

He said: "There were a lot of races where we could have scored a lot of points but our luck has been ridiculous, incredible, and it has to turn around at some point, because it is not right!

"But I am not worried. I suppose it has been better to have had the pace and no luck than have only got some results just based on luck."


